# **BEGINNER:** (practice pad only)

1 2 parts of 2/4 March, 4/4 March

# **NOVICE** (Learner):

- 1 2 parts of 2/4 March
- 2 2 parts of any simple time march

# D GRADE (Elementary):

- 1 4 parts of 2/4 March
- 2 4 parts of 6/8 March

# C GRADE (Sub Intermediate):

- 1 2 or more parts each of March, Strathspey & Reel
- 2 2 or more parts each of Hornpipe into Jig

# **B GRADE** (Intermediate):

- 1 4 parts each of March, Strathspey & Reel
- 2 4 parts each of Hornpipe into Jig

### **OPEN A Grade:**

- 1 4 or more parts each of March, Strathspey & Reel (submit 2 sets, draw at time of play)
- 2 4 or more parts each of Hornpipe into Jig

# All competitors

- Only **one** grade (per type of drum) may be entered in any given solo competition.
- Soloists must play both elements where indicated.
- Soloists must be correctly attired in traditional Highland dress.
- Performance must commence with two three-beat introduction rolls.
- Where a 3/4 is the tune requirement, this means 2 parts, each of 8 bars with repeat (32 bars in total).
- Solo drummer (not any accompanist) to demonstrate control of determining a suitable tempo and give the words of command to commence playing (refer to notes on backing track recordings, below).

# Snare Competitors

Beginner:	May have piper (practice chanter) accompaniment.
Novice & D Grade:	Recommend piper accompaniment.
Open A, B & C Grades:	Must have piper accompaniment.



Grading	Tenor solos will be nominally graded in only three grades. Novice (for	
	beginners), C Grade (for those with some experience) and <b>Open</b> (for	
	very experienced drummers).	
All Grades:	<ul> <li>Highly recommend snare and piper accompaniment to be used.</li> </ul>	

- Complete scores to be played (not orchestrated band settings), including the two three-beat introduction rolls and the first beat note of each tune.
- Rhythmic drum patterns and stick flourish essential.
- Flourish itself will not be critiqued, however, if it positively or negatively affects playing it will attract comment.

Grading	Bass solos will be nominally graded in only two grades. Novice (for
	beginners), and Open (for experienced drummers).
All Grades:	Highly recommend snare and piper accompaniment to be used.

# Backing track recordings

Where backing track recordings are used to accompany a soloist, they must be of high quality. A six-click track should be added to the recording in the format below, to allow the soloist to demonstrate skill in calling tempo and initiating the performance:

Click/beat	Action
1	Warning beat one
2	Warning beat two
3	Soloist calls "Ready"
4	Pause
5	Soloist calls "One" or "Quick"
6	Soloist calls "Two" or "March"
No click	First beat of three-pace roll played

# **Pipe Bands Victoria** Solo Grade Performance Expectations

These points should guide soloists, with the assistance of their tutors (if applicable), in determining which grade it is appropriate to enter.

Only **one** grade (per type of drum) may be entered in any given solo competition.

Grades with entries of more than 15 will play in heats, with a final to be conducted later in the day for the first **three** placegetters in each heat. It is the responsibility of finalists to be aware that they have qualified and present themselves for the final at the nominated time.

# **BEGINNER:**

- Properly execute two three-beat introductory rolls
- Demonstrate ability to execute simple time basic rudiments
- Maintain a somewhat steady tempo

# NOVICE (Learner):

- Demonstrate ability to execute simple time basic rudiments
- Maintain a somewhat steady tempo
- Perform with a degree of expression

**D GRADE** (Elementary):

- Minimum massed bands drum score standard
- Demonstrate the ability to play rudiments and embellishments
- Maintain acceptable tempo for each idiom (style of tune)
- Perform with a reasonable degree of musical expression
- Compete on an instrument tuned to acceptable standards

### C GRADE (Sub Intermediate):

- Capability to perform fundamentals and embellishments with clarity
- Demonstrate a suitable degree of technical difficulty
- Maintain steady tempo on different time signatures
- Generate expressively with some dynamic influence
- Compete on a soundly tuned instrument

### **B GRADE** (Intermediate):

- Accurate execution of all notations
- Demonstrate sympathetic scoring relative to each melody
- High quality and measure of dynamics, phrasing and expression
- Perform at appropriate tempo for each idiom (style of tune)
- Compete on a quality instrument suitably tuned for the surroundings

### **OPEN A GRADE:**

• Demonstrate an exceptional degree of proficiency and excellence in all facets of performance consistently across idioms (technical, expression, tempo control)
